5. Analyse the causes and consequences of civil wars in Africa since 1960. (25 marks)

7. How far can the demise of James II be attributed to his religious inclination? (25 marks)

8. To what extent did the activities of King George III of England contribute to the outbreak of the War of American Independence? (25 marks)

9. The events in the Balkans between June and August 1914 made the First World War inevitable. Discuss. (25 marks)

SECTION D: WORLD; 1919 TO THE PRESENT DATE

10. Evaluate the contributions of Anglo-French Appeasement in the 1920s and 1930s to the collapse of Collective Security. (25 marks)

11. How far was the outbreak of World War II a product of Hitler's aggressions? (25 marks)

12. "Beneficial but imperialistic." Justify this description of relations between *La Francophonie* and her developing member nations. (25 marks)
